4.15	Publish any speech that can incite hatred, consecutive messages, harassment, racist statements, and other hostile behaviors.

The regulations have identified four mechanisms for dealing with behavioral violations for students when "distance learning", namely: **taking sequential procedures, and calculating deduction of behavior degrees** in the event of committing distance learning violations with the same procedures and mechanisms mentioned in the regulation (Student Behavior Management 2018), taking into account the detailed instructions mentioned in the item of procedures for violations according to the degree of violation mentioned in detail in the Student Behavior Management Regulations 2018, and to ensure that the topics are presented within the terms of reference of the behavior management committee, and accordingly the necessary decisions are taken according to the Student Behavior Management Regulations 2018. What is stated in the Student Behavior Management Regulations 2018, and **any third and fourth degree violations may lead to procedures ranging from withdrawing the user's right to enter the smart education portal, monitoring usage, or conducting a service survey retroactively or both, and it may also lead in some cases to a criminal offense E, and there will be disciplinary measures in the event of breaching these conditions and rules.** The "Student Conduct Management 2018" regulation clarified the procedures that are executed against the student who committed any of the previous violations, according to the degree of the violation, and **these procedures start with oral alert, as well as suspension from study, and the student's scores ranged between four degrees and failure in the subject.**
